Cooperation of the CBA with the University of Gdańsk

The Central Anti-Corruption Bureau and the University of Gdańsk will cooperate and jointly undertake information and educational initiatives. The letter of intent in this matter was signed by Andrzej Stróżny, the Head of the Central Anti-Corruption Bureau, and prof. PhD Piotr Stepnowski, Rector of the University of Gdańsk.

The meeting with the Head of the Central Anti-Corruption Bureau was also attended by the Vice-Rector Student Affairs and Education Quality - PhD Arnold Kłonczyński, prof. UG, and the Director of the Centre for Courses and Training dr. Piotr Zieliński.

Developing and strengthening ethical attitudes

According to the provisions of the document, the cooperation primarily concerns undertaking of joint information and education initiatives the aim of which will be to shape and strengthen ethical and civic attitudes among future graduates. The organization of joint training courses will raise awareness of the phenomenon of corruption and shape appropriate ethical attitudes and behaviors in every area of social and economic life.

Cooperation with universities
